Q Graduation & A-G Requirements

- Graduation Requirements are the set of classes that you have to take and GPA requirement to receive a high school diploma.
- A-G Requirements are the set of the classes that you have to take and pass with a or higher to be eligible to apply to the 4-year public Universities in California (UC/CSU system)

Review Typical Grade Level Schedules

- When finalizing schedules, counselors prioritize enrollment in graduation required courses.
- As students complete requirements, more elective choices become available.
- Depending on your student's progress, their schedule may vary from the following examples.

1	World History or AP World History*
2	English 3/4 or English 3/4 Advanced
3	Math (According to your current math. Math II or Math II Adv. for most)
4	Physics or Biology (if taking GUG this year)
5	Spanish or ASL (depending on your current level)
6	2nd Year of PE (AJROTC, Dance, Athletics, or PE)
Advisory	Once a week on Wednesdays

Students who have completed their World Language will have an elective choice.

1	US History, AP US History*, or Mesa College Course* (options will be available during Articulation)
2	American Literature or AP English Lang*
3	Math III or Mesa*?
4	Chemistry or Honors Chemistry*
5	Visual/Performing Arts Class
6	Elective (World Language, AVID, etc.)
Advisory	Once a week on Wednesdays

Students who have completed their Requirements gain an elective choice.



Q Things to Consider



- Future Plans
 - Students who are planning to attend 4-year universities should take the recommended years of courses to be competitive applicant
- Mesa College, CCTE, and AP courses are a great transition into college level work
- Balance rigorous courses to make sure your student can be successful in them

Q Things to Consider



- Summer School is the **best** way to recover any D or F grades in graduation required courses
- Repeating courses during the year is based on availability and not guaranteed
- Recovering courses also allows for more elective options as you complete requirements
- Elective selections are not all guaranteed based on availability. If your chosen course/elective is not offered, an alternative will be offered.
